Welcome back to a new school year!

From October 1, 2019 through November 8, 2019, the McNeese Office of Financial Aid will be conducting Financial Aid Workshops to provide information about the financial aid and FAFSA processes to high school seniors and their families. The workshops address generic financial aid information. (These are not TOPS workshops, but TOPS requirements will be briefly mentioned.)

Regional evening financial aid workshops have been scheduled (see attached flyer), so please help promote this to your seniors and their parents. You can also schedule a daytime informational workshop at your school or an evening informational workshop in the Lake Charles area. Please note that the workshops consist of a presentation and question/answer session and last 30-60 minutes. During these workshops, we will not be assisting with setting up FSA IDs or completing FAFSAs.

To ensure availability, please contact her no later than September 13, 2019. After this date, we cannot guarantee that a workshop will be scheduled for your school.

If you schedule a workshop at your school, you will be contacted prior to the event to confirm date, time, and equipment at your school. A projection screen is required for our presentation. If a multimedia projector and computer will be set up and available, please let us know at the time of the confirmation communication. At the time of the workshop, a counselor or another full-time employee will need to be present for liability and any discipline issues that may arise.

As a reminder, the 2020-21 FAFSA, which becomes available October 1, 2019, will continue to use Prior-Prior Year (PPY) Income information on the FAFSA to provide increased accuracy and give families an earlier and more accurate idea of their anticipated financial aid and college costs. This means that students and their families will use the 2018 tax return information to complete the FAFSA and financial aid process.

Thank you for allowing our office to assist you and your students and a special appreciation to the schools hosting the regional evening workshops outside the Lake Charles area.
